Donations in support of Balkans 35 th will be shown as deferred income until the expenses are actually incurred	
There is \$48,565 in miscellaneous income which are funds received from the PPCLI Foundation and are not in the FTS Legacy Fund.	
Under expenses you will note \$9,622 incurred for replacing Legacy Stones at Patricia Park.	
You will also note \$1,426,56 paid for Balkans 35 th Website.	
Paul advised that they are expecting a large donation to be made to the Balkans 35 th next week.	

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	Dave commented that the HGMF is in excellent financial health with over \$1.7 Million in assets. We will increase our charitable activities accordingly so that we meet CRA disbursement criteria. This is good news for future support to Veterans and Families.	
	Paul highlighted that a possible area to consider is Homes for Heroines. He will pass the information he has to Donna. There is a trial project between the Federal Government and the Pepper Pod in the Ottawa region.

	There was a challenge with confirming individuals connect to the Regiment . We had 10 or 12 applications where we could not confirm a connection to the Regiment.	
8.	We did accept applications from PPCLI Cadet members. Bryan reinforced that PPCLI Cadets should be allowed to apply even after they have left the Cadet Corps. This improves our connection to Cadets and should be required to a letter of support from their Cadet Corps.	
	The bursary committee has decided that an individual could receive a maximum of three Bursaries.	
	Given the rising costs of post-secondary education we may need to increase bursary amounts.	
	Ernie requested that a telephone contact be added to the application form. He has experienced issues with trying to contact successful applicants.

8.	Donna briefed on Veterans House in Calgary. Homes for Heroes is a transitional program for homeless veterans and helps them to recover from their issues over a six month period. It is understood that they are investigating extending this to one year.	
	Veterans House is long term housing for up to 40 veterans in need. It consists of small individual units with kitchen, three piece bathroom and bedroom. A common area with a kitchen, library and exercise / recreational equipment. It also has outdoor space for service dogs, a garden and recreational activities. Donna will do further research on Homeless Female veterans

9.	 a. Patricia Park Update Nine Legacy stones were replaced and the repairs done to the park over a two day period. It was observed the 53 or more stones should be replaced. We need to address the root cause of the damage with snow removal using a blade. Use of a blade must stop and a brush adapter must be used. Or we cease snow removal all together. A committee has been created involving all interested parties and is a work in progress. It is challenging to get everyone together to address the issues. The four damaged pedestals must be repaired. It is obvious that the snow removal contractor damaged the pedestals. So far no one wants to take ownership of this issue. It is believed that a subcontractor caused the damage. b. 2026 Mike Levy Battlefield Tour 	Dave
9.	Currently only 7 individuals have signed up. We need 24 participants for a viable Battlefield Tour by 31 Oct. Very likely that the Tour will be cancelled.	
	c. Balkans 35 th	
	Social Media outreach has been excellent. Patrons have been increased to include RCN, RCAF, RCMP and female veterans. Last week the Balkans 35 th Discussion group has had over 250,000 views.	
	Information is in the process of being passed to Hon Cols. Articles will be placed in RCN and RCAF newsletters.	
	The website is operational. We have decided to go for AI assisted translation. However, we have added additional functions to the website so that translation can be corrected

	as necessary. \$3,600 has been donated to date and website expenses are \$1,900.	
	Working on the Audio / Video interview project and contract. Estimated cost is one million to interview 1,500 veterans with production of six interactive displays for Jan 2027 and documentaries by Oct 2027.	
	Dave has asked if we heard anything back from them with respect to expanding the HGMF objective of supporting history to include the Balkans. Paul will draft a letter to Minister of National Revenue, The Honourable François-Philippe Champagne, P.C., M.P. The letter will highlight the two previous letters and that the lack of response will be taken as approval of expanding the specific objective in the HGMF Constitution.	
	Dave asked who will be managing the contract for the Virtual Interviews. Paul is in the process of drafting a contract which will include hiring a Project Manager. He has no concerns with using Combined Forces. Dave wants to ensure that they are properly compensated for their work. Paul explained that the intent is to compensate the individuals doing the interview \$500 for a 45 to 75 minute video interview with transcripts to be provide to the Project Management Office.	
	d. Frezenberg Memorial Ernie advised that he had been contacted by the Commonwealth War Graves Memorial and trees at the Memorial. The trees are not surviving in the winter and it was recommended that we stop replacing them. It was agreed that we will no longer replace them.
